

Transport policy for students aged 16-18 and continuing students aged 19

Name of CSA and Department responsible:

Cornwall Council Children Services Authority (CSA).

1. Summary of Policy Statement and Main Objectives

Cornwall Council has adopted a policy (16+ Transport Policy 2010/2011) to assist students with subsidised transport. Cornwall's CSA is part of a wider 16+ Transport Partnership, consisting of members from Further Education Establishments, Connexions, Young People's Learning Agency (YPLA), Transport providers and various travel groups. The assistance offered by the CSA may be public transport (trains and buses), contracted buses, taxis or volunteer drivers. Where the Council is unable to offer subsidised transport this does not include students who have been refused subsidised transport in line with the 2010/2011 16+ Transport Policy a travel allowance of 25p per mile may be offered to the parents to drive the student to school sixth form or college. This can only be claimed if there has been a prior agreement to the use of a car.

Eligibility, students must be between the ages of 16 to 19 (under 19 on 01 September 2010) to qualify. Students with special educational needs (16+ Student Transport Policy 2010/2011) can receive assistance up the age of 21 (under 21 on 01 September 2010). A contribution is required towards assistance which for the 2010/2011 academic year is £270, payable in 3 termly instalments of £100, £100 and £70.

Subsidised travel is also available to those schools with sixth forms; students who wish to undertake their Further Education Studies at a local school or local college should contact the Council's Transport Commissioning Department for advice on 0300 1234 101. The transport contribution is £270 for the academic year as above. Download an application form; www.cornwall.gov.uk/collegetransport.

Students who do not agree with Cornwall Council's 16+ Transport Policy 2010/2011 can follow an appeals procedure which can be found on the Council's website www.cornwall.gov.uk/collegetransport. Students on a transport scheme operated by Truro College (14 routes), Cornwall College St Austell (2 routes), Duchy College Stokeclimsland (10 routes) and Bodmin College (2 routes) who wish to make an appeal or complain about their travel arrangements, should contact the college direct in the first instance.

2. Please provide details of any concessionary fares, discounts, subsidies, passes or travel cards available for students in this age group? Please provide details of how much it costs the student?

Several Colleges operate their own schemes, Truro and Penwith College offer a bus pass in conjunction with First Devon & Cornwall Ltd. The contribution for the 2010/2011 academic year is £330.00, if paid in one payment and should be sent to the college by the 13 August 2010. You can also pay the contribution by termly instalments of £118, £118 and £115. If applying after the 13 August the college state they cannot guarantee a ticket for the start of term. There is no upper age limit for students applying for this scheme.

Students living in the Roseland area, who apply for a Truro College pass at the cost above, can also obtain a seat on the link minibus to Hexaswater provided by Cornwall Council, for a contribution which as yet to be agreed.

The Cornwall College Group operates its own travel scheme using contract coaches to its sites in Saltash, St Austell and Camborne. The contribution for the 2010/2011 year is £270, this is payable in termly amounts of £100, £100 and £70. The Camborne site runs a bus from St Just and a minibus from St Agnes; there is one bus from Plymouth to Saltash College and St Austell College has 2 coaches running to its site one from Dobwalls and the other from Bude. In some cases they may offer travel assistance by rail. There is a free morning link bus from St Austell railway/bus station to the college site. Public service routes marked 'CD' on the timetable will carry students directly onto the campus on request. Students attending Newquay Zoo campus will be provided with a free link bus from the Cornwall College (St Austell) site. The Cornwall College Group have negotiated a discount travel scheme with First Devon & Cornwall bus company Ltd for all students, this gives a 1/3 discount on the full adult fare. The scheme is administered on behalf of The Cornwall College Group by Kay Cannon at the St Austell site who can be contacted on 01726 226404.

The Duchy College at Stokeclimsland operates a fleet of minibuses covering 10 routes. Students attending mainstream courses should apply direct to the College for this scheme the contribution for the 2010/2011 academic year is £315 if paid in a single payment. If the contribution is to be paid on a termly basis then the contribution is £345.00 payable in 3 termly instalments of £115. For further details telephone 01579 372207 or contact the college online at www.duchy.ac.uk Students attending the Pathfinder course should apply to Cornwall Children's Services Authority, www.cornwall.gov.uk/collegetransport. The contribution for the subsidised provision is £270 for the 2010/2011 academic year.

Students who apply to Cornwall Council for travel assistance to Duchy College Rosewarne will be provided with travel assistance to the main college campus in Camborne and a link bus to take them to the Rosewarne site. A bus pass for the Rosewarne link only, can be obtained for a contribution of £70 for the 2010/2011 academic year.

City College Plymouth operates its own travel scheme; students should contact the college for further details on 01752 305300 or by email to reception@cityplym.ac.uk or online at www.cityplym.ac.uk.

Students wishing to attend Petroc College (previously North Devon College) should contact the College for further information with regard to their travel arrangements on 01271 345291 or online at www.petroc.ac.uk, this includes students living in Cornwall wishing to study A Levels at the college. Students living in Cornwall intending to study vocational courses at Petroc College should contact Cornwall Council for assistance at www.cornwall.gov.uk/collegetransport

Students with certain learning difficulties can apply for the Cornwall Concessionary Fares scheme. This scheme enables those who are eligible, to receive free travel on local bus services (it does not give discounts on the Council or College run schemes). The pass can be used at all times during weekdays, evenings and weekend travel when services run. Details can be obtained online at www.cornwall.gov.uk/buses and select Disabled people – bus passes from the list shown under the heading Public Transport.

You may consider travel by train within Cornwall or into Plymouth. A Devon and Cornwall Railcard for an annual fee of £10 will give you a 33% discount on most off peak standard fares in Cornwall. You can get more information about this or purchase the railcard from staffed stations in Cornwall and Plymouth and at National Rail Travel Agents in Cornwall or visit www.firstgreatwestern.co.uk or call 08457 000 125. Season tickets are available for seven day or one month periods.

The First Devon & Cornwall Bus Group offer Scholar Bus Passes these passes are available to students up to the age of 18 years who are attending full time education for at least 16 hours per week. Passes can be purchased on a ½termly, termly or annual basis. They are valid for one journey from the students start location to their academic institution arriving before 0900 and one journey back from the student's academic institution to their start location. The First scholar bus pass is also valid for unlimited travel on all First bus services after 1600 Monday to Friday during term time and all day Saturday and Sunday. The termly pass is also valid for unlimited travel during the half term holiday (during the term for which the pass is valid) and the holiday period at the end of the term for which the pass was valid (excluding the Summer vacation period). The annual pass is also valid for use during half term, plus the Christmas, Easter and Summer vacation periods. The First scholar pass must be shown to the driver on every journey. If no pass can be produced at the time of travel then the ordinary single fare must be paid. If a pass is lost up to one duplicate pass may be issued at the discretion of First Devon & Cornwall Ltd. A charge will be made for a replacement pass. You should contact First Devon & Cornwall Customer Service Team on 0845 600 1420 (Mon – Fri 0800 -1800, Sat 0800 – 1400) or email firstdevonandcornwall.scholars@firstgroup.com to obtain a quote on a Scholar pass for your requirements.

The First Devon & Cornwall Bus Group offer peak and off peak bus tickets; the cost varies depending on the time you travel, further details can be obtained from www.firstgroup.com or by telephone to Traveline on 0871 200 22 33.

West Cornwall Community Wheels operates a dial-a-ride services in parts of Penwith and West Kerrier, which provides a link from rural settlements into the public transport network, telephone 01736 787364 for more information on this scheme.

The Wheels to Work and Wheels to Learn schemes offer low-cost moped and bicycle loan at a cost of £7 per week for people without access to transport who need to get to work or education. 14 – 19 Diplomas in Cornwall, level 3 qualifications of the new diploma are being delivered in colleges, students who opt to undertake the Diploma at a college will benefit from the same transport arrangements listed earlier in this paragraph. For further information please contact the 14-19 Co-ordinator at your school or at the college where you intend to study for your diploma.

3. During what times of the day can students' use their travel pass or obtain concessionary fares?

Contract bus passes issued by either the Council or by a College can be used for a journey for the start of the college day, and once at the end of the college day to go home. The times of these buses are not flexible as they are set timetables transport will not be scheduled to accommodate each individual student's course timetable.

Service passes issued by the Council or by a College can be used once before 12:00 hours to arrive at the College or School and once for a return in the afternoon between 12:00 and 18:00. Any travel after 6 p.m. must be authorised by the College. Passes are only valid for travel between the college and the stated destination on the ticket.

The First Devon & Cornwall Bus Group offer Scholar Bus Passes these passes are available to students up to the age of 18 years who are attending full time education for at least 16 hours per week. Passes can be purchased on a ½termly, termly or annual basis. They are valid for one journey from the students start location to their academic institution arriving before 0900 and one journey back from the student's academic institution to their start location. The First scholar bus pass is also valid for unlimited travel on all First bus services after 1600

Monday to Friday during term time and all day Saturday and Sunday. The termly pass is also valid for unlimited travel during the half term holiday (during the term for which the pass is valid) and the holiday period at the end of the term for which the pass was valid (excluding the Summer vacation period). The annual pass is also valid for use during half term, plus the Christmas, Easter and Summer vacation periods. The First scholar pass must be shown to the driver on every journey. If no pass can be produced at the time of travel then the ordinary single fare must be paid. If a pass is lost up to one duplicate pass may be issued at the discretion of First Devon & Cornwall Ltd. A charge will be made for a replacement pass. The Truro and Penwith College travel scheme offer a pass on a First Devon & Cornwall bus route to college which can also be used in the Evenings, Weekends and Holidays.

Students with special educational or mobility needs may apply for the Cornwall Concessionary Fares scheme. The scheme enables those who are eligible to receive free travel on local bus services (it does not give a discount on the Council or Colleges' schemes). The pass can be used at all times during weekdays, evenings and weekend travel when services run. Details can be obtained online at www.cornwall.gov.uk/buses and select Disabled People – Bus Passes from the list shown under the heading Public Transport.

4. Please confirm that support will continue to be made available to students who reach 19 whilst continuing on a course?

Students on the Council travel scheme who turn 19 during the academic year will continue to be assisted until the end of the academic year in which they turned 19. After that consideration can be given to further assistance but only as Concessionary Riders on contract vehicles where there is spare capacity.

For students on the Truro and Penwith College scheme, there is no upper age limit.

Students of the Cornwall College Group would normally receive assistance over the age of 19 but should contact the college for confirmation.

Special Needs Students will be assisted to the age of 21 on the Council scheme to attend either a Special School (up to age 19) or a mainstream college.

The following colleges have been provided with specially adapted minibuses by the 16+ Transport Partnership - Penwith, Truro and The Cornwall College Group (2) Camborne and St Austell. These vehicles are primarily for 21 to 25 year old special needs students. They may be able to assist travel from your area to college; all enquiries should be to the relevant college.

5. How will students be assessed to see if they are eligible for support? Eg, means testing?

For the Council scheme you must be under 19 on 01 September 2010 or under 21 for Special Needs students. You should be a full time student attending college for at least 450 guided learning hours per year, over the three terms of the 2010/2011 academic year and live more than three miles from the nearest school or college offering the course (or similar).

For travel assistance via a college scheme you should obtain and complete the relevant application form from the college.

A bursary scheme is run by Truro and Penwith College to help some students towards the cost of travel to College. Any student who requires assistance should contact Student Services in the Allen Building room A012 or telephone 01872 267124 for the Truro Site and 01736 335000 for the Penwith Site.

6. What help do you provide for students with disabilities and/or learning difficulties or facing other difficulties in following their courses?

Specialised transport may be provided for students with disabilities and/or learning difficulties on receipt of letters of support from their Doctor, Social Worker, Education Psychologist, current school and prospective college supporting the need for special transport provision, giving information of the student's transport requirements. Information from other relevant organisations may also be helpful.

Students attending the County's Special Schools, Curnow, Doubletrees and Nancealverne will be provided with 3 years of travel assistance up to the age of 19 and then for 2 years at a mainstream college or 5 years of assistance at a mainstream college. Students from year 11 at Pencalenick School will be provided with 5 years of assistance from the age of 16 at a further education college.

In certain circumstances transport may be provided for students to travel beyond their nearest establishment, this can be agreed on receipt of letters of support from the current school and prospective college stating that it is in the student's best interests, eg, on account of future study requirements.

Special Needs students who attend residential courses outside of the County post 16, funded by the Young People's Learning Agency, may receive travel assistance from Cornwall Council. You should write to the Special Education Assessment and Provision Team, Inney Building, County Hall, Truro, TR1 3AY, telephone 0300 1234 100 for details.

Truro and Penwith College and The Cornwall College Group have been awarded a grant through the Post 16 Transport Partnership to offer assistance with a "Travel Buddy", which provides support for students with special needs, enabling them to take advantage of public and other provided transport. You should seek advice through the Student Services Section at the relevant college for further details.

7. Do you provide mobility/independence training for students who face difficulty with transport?

Consideration is given by the Council to every student who requests specialised travel assistance and provided evidence supporting the application is supplied, appropriate transport will be considered. Many special needs students are generally given mobility or independence training as part of their course content.

Truro and Penwith College and The Cornwall College Group have been awarded a grant through the Post 16 Transport Partnership to offer assistance with a "Travel Buddy"; (see para 6 above). Please seek advice through the Student Services Section at the relevant college for further details.

8. When should students start to apply for transport support?

Application details are available to students through the Cornwall Council website at www.cornwall.gov.uk/collegetransport or through the Cornwall Council Passenger Transport Unit on 0300 1234 222 from the end of May 2010; you can apply for assistance any time from the 01 June 2010 until the 10 August 2010. Applications received after the 10 August 2010 may not be processed.

It is advisable to apply early as large numbers of applications are submitted in the weeks leading up to the deadline date of the 10 August 2010.

If you are unsure about which course you wish to follow, please check your transport eligibility/availability early.

9. What transport help can students apply for if they need to attend a course that is beyond your CSA area?

Students who qualify for assistance to attend a College in Plymouth are provided with either rail passes or First Devon & Cornwall bus passes. Special Needs students will be provided with transport suitable for their individual needs. Students living in Calstock and Gunnislake may be provided with travel assistance to attend Tavistock College if their address is nearer to Tavistock than Callington. Travel assistance is offered to Petroc College as detailed in paragraph 1.

10. What help is available for students who attend a further education institution which is beyond daily travelling distance and they need to stay away?

In some cases the Council will offer travel assistance Monday and Friday only to a student to attend an establishment beyond daily travelling distance.

Students may apply to the college they will be attending for assistance with lodging expenses. Some students may qualify for assistance through the 2010/2011 Further Education Residential Support Scheme which is funded by the Young People's Learning Agency, more details can be obtained online at www.direct.gov.uk/en/EducationAndLearning/14to19/MoneyToLearn/ExtraHelp or by telephoning 0845 602 2260.

Most colleges keep a database of approved accommodation with the college landlord and landlady association these offer affordable lodgings to students. At Truro College there is limited accommodation at their Tregye Campus. The Duchy College at Stokeclimsland also offers accommodation on site; enquires should be made to the College Student Services section on 01579 372208.
