# ON-SITE TRANSPORT AND PARKING POLICY

The Governing Body and college are committed to encourage staff and students to use healthy and environmentally friendly forms of transport whenever practicable. Therefore walking, car sharing and use of pedal cycles is to be encouraged.

The key elements of this policy is the safety of staff, students and other users of the college by the separation of traffic and pedestrians whenever possible.

Only vehicles to drive on college sports fields and other non-road areas, are grounds maintenance personnel vehicles.

To this end the area cross-hatched red (on the attached plan) is prohibited to vehicles except when moving to or from an authorised parking area, but not during a break when students are using the area hatched red. Other areas of the college roadways are identified with double yellow lines and parking is prohibited at all times. Anyone arranging deliveries to the college should specify that deliveries are to be made out of college hours and any delivery vehicle must have an audible warning device when reversing.

Visitors must only park in the area adjacent to the Alternative School and then report to the main reception on arrival.

The one-way system and 5 mph speed limit are major components in the strategy in mitigating any potential for accidents. All movement of traffic between 3.00 p.m. and 3.10 p.m. in or out of college is prohibited.

Students in the Sixth Form are permitted to bring cars and motorcycles to the college. They should be taxed, insured and the driver should hold an appropriate licence to drive the vehicle. All students should park in the lower school car park. Blue areas are for Library visitors.

Members of staff and Sixth Form students should hold a vehicle pass which should be displayed when the vehicle is parked in the college.

During the current new construction programme extreme care should be exercised when contractors vehicles are moving.

The Site Manager has been requested to monitor use of the visitors car park by local residents and other unauthorised users.
